

## “Nourishing Spaces” Project Workshop in Cape Town, South Africa

The project dubbed “Nourishing Spaces” seeks to develop urban-scale responses to diet-related non-communicable diseases in six African cities: Cape Town and Kimberley (South Africa); Nairobi and Kisumu (Kenya); and Windhoek and Oshakati (Namibia).
